#### THE GUARANTOR OF OUR FAITH Romans 8:28-39 August 28, 2022

### **1. Our <u>Need</u> for a Guarantor**

• What is a *guarantor*?

Webster's One who undertakes to answer for the payment of a debt or the performance of a duty of another in case of the other's default or miscarriage.

- **\*** Why do we need a *guarantor* of our faith?
  - **>** Because of the <u>Spiritual Blessings</u> we receive
  - **>** Because of <u>Accusations</u>
  - Because of our Pain
  - **Because of our <u>Unbelief</u>**
- What difference does it (should it) make that Christ is our guarantor?
  - > The <u>BASIS</u> of our Blessings
  - > The <u>Payment</u> of our Debt
  - **>** The <u>Empathy</u> of our Suffering
  - **Grace** <u>AND</u> <u>Justice</u>

## 2. God as Guarantor

- v. 28 And we know that <u>God</u> causes everything to work together for our good
- v. 29 For <u>God</u> knew his people in advance, & <u>He</u> chose them to become like his Son,
- v. 30 And having chosen them, <u>He</u> called them to come to him. & <u>He</u> gave them right standing with himself, & <u>He</u> promised them his glory. If <u>God</u> is for us, who can ever be against us?
- v. 32 Since <u>God</u> did not spare even his own Son but gave him up for us all, won't <u>God</u>, who gave us Christ, also give us everything else?
- v. 33 Who dares accuse us whom <u>God</u> has chosen for his own? Will God? No! <u>He</u> is the one who has given us right standing with himself.
- He Causes <u>everything</u> to work together for our good (v. 28) – Divine Sovereignty / Providence
- He <u>Knew</u> us even before anything was created (v. 29) IntimacyHe <u>Chose</u> us to become like His Son (v. 29) – Divine Purpose
- He <u>Called</u> us to come to Him (v. 30) Direction

- He Gave us <u>right standing</u> with Himself (v. 30) Standing
- The Promised us His glory (v. 30) Future Hope
- The Gave us His own Son (v. 32) Love

# 3. Christ as Guarantor

v. 34 – Who then will condemn us? Will Christ Jesus? No, for <u>He</u> is the one who <u>died</u> for us and <u>was raised to life</u> for us and <u>is</u> sitting at the place of highest honor next to God, <u>pleading</u> for us.

v. 35 - Can <u>anything</u> ever separate us from Christ's love? Does it mean he no longer loves us if we have trouble or calamity, or are persecuted, or are hungry or cold or in danger or threatened with death?

vv. 37-39 - No, despite all these things, overwhelming victory is ours through Christ, who <u>loved us</u>. And I am convinced that nothing can ever separate us from his love.... Nothing in all creation will ever be able to separate us from the love of God that is revealed in Christ Jesus our Lord.

- The died for us (v. 34) No Limit to His Love
- He was <u>raised</u> to <u>life</u> for us (v. 34) No Limit to His power
- He is <u>pleading</u> for us (v. 34) No Limit to His Protection
- He loves us. (vv. 35-37) -

## A Truth to Remember:

God has provided EVERYTHING we need to secure our eternal future with Him. Jesus, Himself, guarantees that!

## A Challenge to Consider:
